Message from Inspector Selvarajah

We have had a busy month..... Officers from Diss, Harleston and Long Stratton supported Trading Standards in executing two warrants for on line fraud in our area. The team also supported officers from across the region in making a number of arrests linked to a series of burglaries. We also located a cannabis factory in Tharston where over 1000 cannabis plants were seized and two people arrested. I would like to remind everyone not to leave items of value on display within vehicles. We have had a few easily avoidable thefts from vehicles. Businesses in Diss and Harleston are reporting pallets being stolen. We suggest securing them to avoid becoming a victim.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	0	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Beat Manager Pc Baker

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been conducting plain clothes patrols around the night-time economy, targeting ASB and drug dealers. This resulted in significant intelligence being gained and disruption to those dealing drugs.

These operations will continue and the police have the continued support of the pub watch members.

Reports of anti-social behaviour in Diss town centre has resulted in an increase in foot patrol with person's being dealt with and arrested when necessary.

Rural patrols continue, targeting wildlife offences and heritage watch.

On 10th January there was a public meeting held in DISS by the police, the meeting was well attended and a presentation was given. I was on hand to discuss matters with those there.
