Message from Inspector Selvarajah

My team and I have been busy working on the priorities set through recent engagement surgeries namely; vehicle related ASB, speeding and drugs. We are receiving support from our roads policing colleagues to assist in tackling issues concerning the gathering of cars in Diss and Harleston car parks which go on to cause annoyance to the local community. We have seized over 40 vehicles since January and made nearly 150 arrests for incidents across Diss, Harleston and Long Stratton policing areas. We look forward to meeting members of the local council's and community at our 6 monthly meeting now being held in Harleston on 9th August.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	1	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	2	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Beat Manager Pc Baker

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been concentrating their time on the 3 priorities set by the street surgery- Speeding, Anti-social use of motor vehicles and Drugs. TOR's have been issued to drivers as a result of this and vehicles have been seized.

This month I was working with student officer PC NORMAN, with our targeted patrols we discovered a crop of 19 cannabis plants, a person possessing Class A drugs and drivers using their mobile phones, whilst also dealing with other matters.

There has been a number of burglaries this month, it is important that in this hot weather windows are kept shut when you are going out for the day, also keep gardening equipment locked away when not in use. This is to prevent our own items being used to break into your home.

I would like to remind people that correct way to report crimes or incidents is not to discuss them on a Facebook group page, these pages are not monitored by the police. Please report matters via the Norfolk police website, 101, crime stoppers or 999 in an emergency.
