Message from Inspector Selvarajah

As a District we have seen a significant uplift in demand resulting in my officers having to prioritise attending emergency and priority incidents. This is similar with the rest of the Country and overall there appears to be no significant change in crime. We have seen some opportunist crimes occur as windows and doors have been left open. We remind everyone to secure your valuables, home, car, shed and outbuildings. We have now gone live with a carriageway clearance project, which involves a new 4x4 vehicle and associated training provided by Highways England. This means we aim where possible to remove highway obstructions more efficiently.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	0	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

The idea comes after the incredible success of a concept launched in Pasco County, Florida in America, which asks the public to check certain things around their home at a designated time.

By completing the #9PMRoutine residents are making life so much harder for offenders. This will ultimately result in a reduction in crime.

Residents are asked to conduct the following checks:

Check your vehicles, Shut your windows, Lock your doors and Check your outbuildings

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been concentrating their time on the 3 priorities set by the street surgery- Speeding, Anti-social use of motor vehicles and Drugs.

Letters have been sent out to the owners of vehicles that have been seen driven in an anti-social manner and numerous TOR's have been issued for excess speed.

A number of burglaries have occurred across the area this month, it is important that the public remain vigilant and call the police when required.

Matters are being reported on facebook community groups, these are not monitored by the police and it is important that crimes and anti-social behaviour are reported via the correct channels. This is clearly leading to frustration as members of the public are expecting action to be taken from what they write or for what they have read on facebook.
