Message from Inspector Selvarajah

My team is working hard to tackle vehicle related anti- social behaviour in Diss and Harleston. They have been engaging with young drivers and targeting persistent offenders. A vehicle was stolen near Long Stratton over the weekend when the driver left keys in the ignition whilst unloading shopping. Its worth remembering as the cold weather approaches not to leave vehicles running whilst unattended. Operation Gravity is our response to County Lines which relates to gangs and organised crime networks exploiting children and vulnerable people to deal drugs. I ask communities to remain vigilant and report suspicious activity.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	1	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	2	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Beat Manager Pc Baker

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been concentrating their time on the 3 priorities set by the street surgery- Speeding, Anti-social use of motor vehicles and Drugs.

Norfolk constabulary specials have been assisting across the area with their own traffic initiatives. Numerous TOR's have been issued by the special constabulary and the SNT for speeding and no insurance. I have also assisted community speed watch by spending some time with them to discuss the issues of speeding.

There have been reports of drug use in recreational area's- these have been reported on Facebook and not directly to the police. As such the intelligence from these reports is being missed.

I encourage those with reports of drugs use, to report the matter to the police directly or crime stoppers.

Plan clothes and hi-visibility patrols take place across the area in relation to ASB and drug use. When I am able to I will update you on any results.

I have had regular contact with the licensees this month, and as a result two persons have been banned by pub watch members from their pubs.

The Public enquiry office at Diss continues to be open on a Friday between 4 PM and 6 PM.
