Message from Inspector Selvarajah

This month my team have been focused on tackling a gang problem, which is developing across Diss and Harleston. There has been lots of media focus recently concerning knife, drug and gang crime. Our Safer Neighbourhood Team have presented secondary schools with tailored information and we have spoken with a number of children/ young adults and their parents about the risks of being involved in gangs. On 02/03/2019 we held an awareness event in Diss, which was well attended and aimed at educating children, young adults and their families of the risks and signs of gang activity. Op Gravity is our organisational response to the County Lines problems involving drug supply here in Norfolk. We are working closely with our partners to tackle this issue, which is not just a matter for the police. If you have any information concerning gangs please don't hesitate to contact us.

Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	2	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Beat Manager Pc Baker

Diss Safer Neighbourhood Team have been concentrating their time on the 3 - Speeding, Anti-social use of motor vehicles and Drugs.

In FEBRUARY in Diss there has been reports of a 'gang'. This has been in the new papers and across social media. The SNT ran a knife crime presentation at Diss MERE which was well attended and gave guidance to those that we spoke with. Knife crime presentations have also been given in all secondary school's in the area.

I have personally visited a number of alleged gang members and spoken with them and their parents. I have also spoke with High school's in DISS and EYE to monitor the situation.

The police are acting on intelligence received and a number of people have been detained and searched regarding weapons and drugs.

Patrols continue in Diss town centre and across the area.
